OUR CORE AREAS OF SERVICE INCLUDE:



EMERGENCY SERVICES

For families experiencing housing insecurity.

Families at risk of either losing their home or having to enter a shelter, who are in a position to attain stability with a little bit of assistance and support, are met with tangible assistance, case management, and opportunities for future community with Family Promise of Greater Wichita.



SHELTER SERVICES

For families currently experiencing homelessness.

Each family that seeks shelter with FPGW enters the flagship Rotation Program.
Families with longer term barriers might eventually move into Bridge to Housing - a static shelter model - to make room for additional families in Rotation and be empowered to clear final hurdles to housing.

STABILIZATION SERVICES

For families who have completed case management through Emergency or Shelter Service programs.

Ongoing support and community are offered to every family and their children. Shelter Graduates facing extra barriers to affordable housing might utilize the Almost Home transitional housing program as an opportunity for future sustainability.

1,087 individuals served across all core programs



including 740 children



108 families spared the trauma of homelessness through prevention programs



with an average one-time cost of only \$267 per child.



10,250 bed nights provided by the faith community and other community partners.



2,428 individuals served with at least a referral

BEHIND THE NUMBERS



EMERGENCY SERVICES:

Brad*, a single dad raising two young children on his own, reached out to FPGW for assistance with rent. Brad worked for a major company in Wichita and had been laid off in July.

While Brad was rehired by the same company in August, this temporary loss of income caused him to fall behind on rent and the landlord put an eviction notice on his door.

The FPGW case manager completed a budget with Brad and, once he reestablished his income, he would have more than enough to cover all of his living expenses. With only one month of financial assistance, this family was able to stay in their housing and avoid the trauma of homelessness.

SHELTER SERVICES:

Adea*, a single mother with teenage children, found her family in need of shelter after a long road of tragedy and hardship.

Originally displaced by Hurricane Katrina in 2005, Adea's family had spent almost two decades trying to find stability and safety. Through abuse, theft, health issues, and other struggles including unfair and unethical landlord practices and eventual eviction, Adea tried to stay strong for her children.

Seeking shelter with FPGW, Adea found a new strength and support system. Her family is now in transitional housing, reunited with their beloved pet who was fostered during their time in shelter, and see a bright future ahead of them.

STABILIZATION SERVICES:

Ellen*, a recent Shelter Services Graduate, found herself still struggling with transportation issues - a regular occurrence in our community.

FPGW case managers were able to pay for Ellen to go to driving school so that she was able to obtain a driver's license and get a vehicle for her and her large family.

This support - a part of the Keys for Success program - was able to help Ellen eliminate \$500 a month of Lyft/Uber costs, allowing her to invest her money toward eliminating debts and overcoming other barriers in order to take more steps toward sustainable independence.

STRATEGIC GROWTH

In 2022, Family Promise of Greater Wichita laid out a renewed Strategic Plan for the organization, including growth and policy improvements across all key programs. This Strategic Plan also included future plans for a Family Promise Campus in the heart of Wichita, making room for organizational stability and room for the FPGW mission to continue to grow in the way that it extends hope and dignity to families in our community.





A dream realized...A future secured.

In August of 2023, Family Promise of Greater Wichita purchased a building at 1111 N St Francis. This purchase, while sooner than the FPGW team could have dreamed, paved the way for significant improvements to the infrastructure of programs and efforts across our organization.

Over the Fall and Winter months, FPGW partnered with Hutton on small construction projects and with an incredible network of volunteers who helped paint, clean, build, and more. FPGW held a ribbon cutting ceremony and open house at this new location after officially moving in January 2024.

Building Highlights

- Purchased and renovated with zero debt for FPGW
- Sweat equity of more than 1,500 volunteer hours before Open House
- Allows for individual spaces for each Guest family and confidential spaces for each staff member to hold case management and partner meetings
- Brings all core FPGW activities under one roof, including graduation celebrations, staff/board meetings, clothes closet, and life skills classes
- Large footprint and extra interior space, allowing room for growth and continued renovation as needed for program expansion
- Located in the heart of the highest poverty ZIP code in the state of Kansas


