2022 was another year of exponential growth for Family Promise of Greater Wichita (FPGW). This growth was made possible through our abundant community of volunteers and supporters and allowed us to serve almost 1,000 individuals throughout the year!

While this growth presented challenges in work loads and resources, we have been able to set the groundwork for a sustainable future not only for FPGW families, but for our organization as a whole. Staff and volunteer teams are now in place to better serve the families we met in 2022 and to truly offer a holistic approach to additional families moving forward.

Paired with this tremendous growth, 2022 also saw a strategic planning process that offered both hindsight and foresight. As we gathered feedback from our community, we were affirmed that the work we are doing is making a difference, and that the things that we place a priority on - things like staff and volunteer interactions with families and the dignity that each individual is treated with - really are incredibly impactful.

With the priorities set forth in our updated Strategic Plan, we find a chance to serve more families in the way we do it best. As one graduate said, "This organization has stood by me." This is what I love most about Family Promise - that we can do just that and not just serve families in the midst of crisis, but be the support network that stands by them and maintains a relationship as they continue to move forward and overcome the storms of life.

I am still amazed that we were able to make it through the intense growth of the past year and am excited that we are now set up to serve the volume of families with children that are seeking services at Family Promise.

Our growth in capacity has been both organic and strategic - and with the launch of our Bridge to Housing program - expanding the number of families we can serve in shelter - and by adding on specialized case management staff members, I know that we are poised to go deeper with the families that we're serving.

Through the growth on the road ahead, our Board and Staff teams have made a commitment to uphold our core values with our efforts. We are determined not to be an organization that just writes checks, but one that stays on mission and takes a holistic approach to caring for and supporting families.


Mission Statement

Every child deserves a home.


CORE AREAS OF CARE

Emergency Services



For families experiencing housing insecurity. Families at risk of either losing their home or having to enter a shelter, who are in a position to attain stability with a little bit of assistance and support, are met with tangible assistance, case management, and opportunities for future community with Family Promise of Greater Wichita.

Shelter Services



For families currently experiencing homelessness. Each family that seeks shelter with FPGW enters the flagship Rotation Program. Families with longer term barriers might eventually move into Bridge to Housing - a static shelter model - to make room for additional families in Rotation and be empowered to clear final hurdles to housing.



Stabilization Services



For families who have completed case management through Emergency or Shelter Service programs. Ongoing support and community are offered to every family and their children. Shelter Graduates facing extra barriers to affordable housing might utilize the Almost Home transitional housing program as an opportunity for future sustainability.

holistic approach

In 2022, FPGW sought to continue to serve families through a truly holistic and focused approach. **By expanding staff support, families were met with specialized and wrap-around case management.**

FPGW Family Advocates walk alongside families to lead the way together - identifying barriers, establishing goals, and working toward sustainable independence with the support of the FPGW community.



community involvement

This year, FPGW met with and/or partnered with more than 120 community partners, including 30 faith congregations.

Funding for programs came mostly from individuals and families, reflecting the grassroots support for the work of Family Promise that makes this mission so effective!



sustainable solutions



Guests and graduates overwhelmingly stated that the most impactful part of their time at Family Promise was the **PEOPLE**. Interaction with volunteers in the Rotation program was important and left a lasting impression.

All members of the vast FPGW network - including guests, graduates, volunteers, coordinators, staff members, board members, donors, and community partners - are excited for continued growth, but remain focused on maintaining the important value of families being met with dignity, relationship, and holistic care.


